Evaluating implementation

Authority -The hazards of the companies are assessed in accordance with local regulation No. 131 "Industrial accident risk assessment procedures and risk mitigation measures«. Responsible authorities: State Environmental Monitoring Bureau, State Environmental Service and State Fire and Rescue Service.

In addition: The joint inspection program of the services envisages a complex inspection, which shall be performed at least once a calendar year - in each object of the highest risk level; every three years - at each lower risk object.

Operator - Company documentation is coordinated with all involved services. This documentation must be updated every 5 years or whenever the types and quantities of hazardous substances change in the establishment.

Confidentiality - The documentation should not contain information such as the trade names of the different substances, but should include information on the physical, chemical, toxicological or ecotoxicological properties of the dangerous substances, ways and means to make the dangerous substances safe, etc.
