Evaluating implementation –

Authority - Please briefly describe any rules or guidance followed **by authorities** in implementing their duties

In the law there is an annex in which there are specified requirements of what should the information to the public contain. These informations are controlled during inspections.

Operator - How does the authority evaluate that the implementation **by the operator** is effective the requirement, (e.g., criteria, minimum information, frequency, methods)?

During inspections is controlled if the information is properly elaborated, well structured, up to date and if it was delivered to persons likely to be affected by a major accident.

Confidentiality - How do we deal with the requests for confidentiality? What information do we consider as confidential? Are there any criteria developed for declaring information as confidential?

The operator is required to mark some parts or data in the list of dangerous substances or in safety report which are considered as trade secret or should be kept confidential for the protection of intellectual property and personal data. Revised safety report must contain at least general informations about the hazards leading to a major industrial accident and about possible consequences on human health, property and environment. The operator submits a modified list of dangerous substances or modified safety report to district office in the regional capital and to Ministry of Environment.
